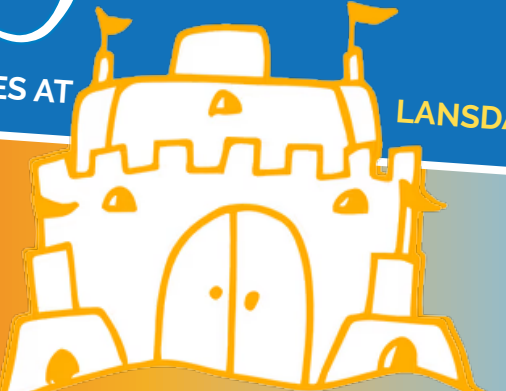

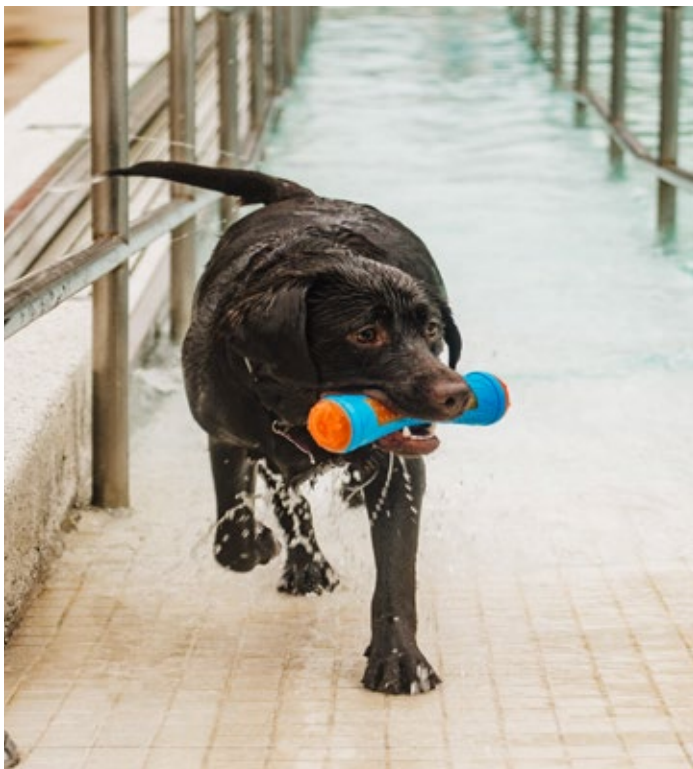

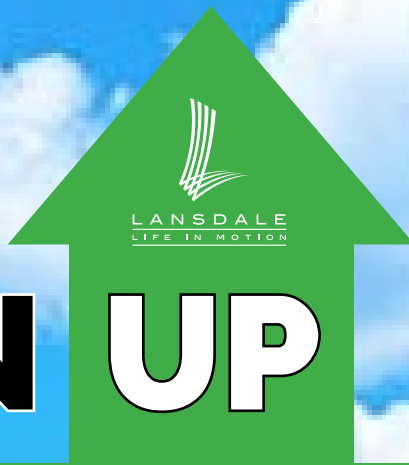

Every summer, I find myself drawn back to Lansdale's parks and pools, where so many of my favorite memories were made. Here in the Borough, we're fortunate to have two wonderful pool facilities to enjoy, along with parks and trails that connect our community in a special way.

As much as we all love these spaces, time does take its toll. Equipment wears out, sidewalks crack and the needs of our community continue to evolve. Today's park-goers expect more than a swing set and a bench under a tree, and rightly so. That's why we've made it a priority to upgrade our parks and pools to be safe, sustainable and inclusive. Improving worn equipment and enhancing trails isn't just about appearances. It's about keeping our spaces welcoming for everyone, from small children to seniors, and making our parks true extensions of our homes, especially for neighbors who may not have a backyard of their own.

I'm especially excited about the updates at **West Fifth Street Park**. I say that with the usual construction asterisks...a few moving parts could nudge the timeline, but we're still very hopeful everything will be wrapped up before 2026.

These updates focus primarily on the baby and intermediate pools but will be a welcome improvement for all members.

While pool improvements are making a splash, there's also a small-but-mighty upgrade at **White's Road Park** that's already becoming a family favorite: a new restroom facility along the trail. It includes two single unisex ADA-accessible stalls and a water bottle refill station, conveniently located next to the new pavilion and accessible playground. We're thrilled to see how well it's being used already.

Switching gears from refreshed favorites to something entirely new, be sure to check out the award winning **Wedgewood Park Traffic Garden**. This kid-friendly mini street setup gives children a fun, hands-on way to learn how to walk and bike safely. It fills an important need in our park system and it's been wonderful to see an area that was once underused now buzzing with families.

And just when you think there couldn't be more upgrades, there's more. Our **Trail Paving Project** widened existing trails and improved ADA accessibility, making it easier and safer to walk, bike and connect between parks and neighborhoods. These improvements support active transportation and help strengthen the connections that continue to bring Lansdale together.

As the summer season unfolds, I encourage you to get out and enjoy Lansdale's familiar favorites along with the exciting new improvements to our park system. Whether you're cooling off at White's Road or Fourth Street Pool, exploring a shaded trail, or watching your kids laugh and play at West Fifth Street Park, these spaces are where community and nature truly come together. I hope you'll create summer memories of your own that last for years to come, just as Lansdale parks have done for me throughout my time in the Borough.

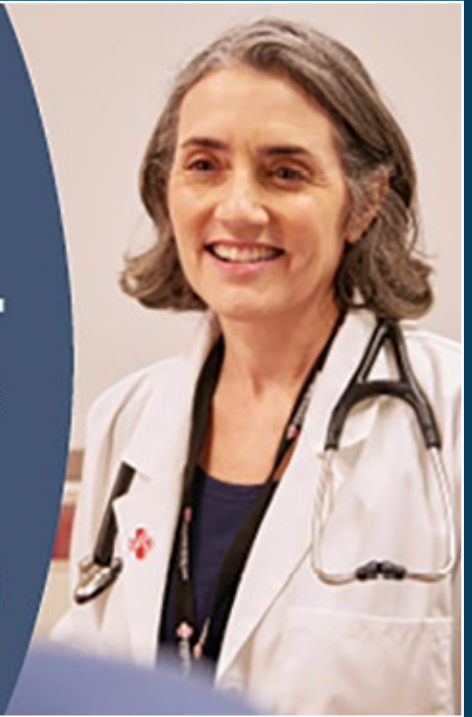

ELECTRIC INCREASES *explained*

To help our residents and businesses understand these changes, here are some answers to common questions about the increases.

You may have noticed your electric bill has been a bit higher than usual. That's because the cost of electricity has been rising and the Borough has made updates to make sure we can continue providing the reliable, high-quality service you expect. Part of this includes the Purchase Power Cost Adjustment (PPCA), which simply passes the actual cost the Borough pays for electricity, no more, no less.

Reliability is a major benefit of Lansdale's locally owned electric system and this adjustment helps ensure your service stays dependable. While no one likes to see a higher bill, these changes are necessary to maintain system reliability and to keep service standards high.

- **Why are my electric bills higher than before?**
Starting February 2026, bills reflect two new items: the recent electric rate adjustment and the Purchase Power Cost Adjustment (PPCA).
- **What is the PPCA?** The PPCA tracks the cost of electricity the Borough buys. If the cost goes up or down, the PPCA adjusts your bill accordingly so you pay exactly what the Borough pays.
- **What caused electric rates to increase nationwide?**
Wholesale electricity costs, including power and capacity charges, have gone up this year. Capacity charges ensure there's enough electricity available during peak demand periods.
- **Why is the Borough adjusting rates?**
To keep your service reliable and the system performing well, the Borough needs to adjust rates to keep up with rising wholesale costs. Without this, reliability and service quality could be negatively affected.

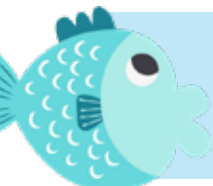

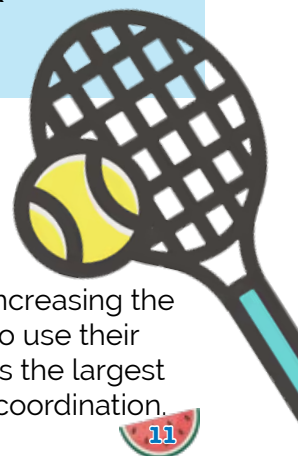



summer STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

1. WASH YOUR CAR AT A CAR WASH. Soapy run-off from vehicles washing in your driveway can enter the stormdrain, however commercial car washes filter and reuse their water.



2. RAISE YOUR MOWER HEIGHT. Raising your mower height to at least three inches will allow your yard to absorb more water.

3. DO NOT BLOW GRASS CLIPPINGS OFF YOUR PROPERTY. Grass clippings can carry fertilizers into waterways. Either bag up grass clippings or recycle them on your yard to return vital nitrogen to your lawn.



4. INCREASE YOUR GARDEN AREA. Plant native shrubs, trees and perennials on your property. Native plants can absorb more stormwater than turf grass and provide habitat areas for wildlife.



burn smart, DO YOUR PART



The Borough does allow outdoor recreational fires as well as portable outdoor fireplaces. But before you light any fires, be sure you know the regulations and safety precautions.

Location and Size

- The minimum distance from a structure or any combustible material is 15 feet
- Chiminea, metal ring, stone/brick surrounds and outdoor fireplaces are approved containers for outdoor fires
- Containers **MUST BE** used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and the 2015 International Fire Code

Materials to Burn

- Clean, seasoned and dry firewood can be used
- **DO NOT** burn leaves, grass, trash or construction materials

Supervision

- Recreational fires must be constantly attended until fully extinguished
- Suitable extinguishing agents include 4-A rated extinguisher, dirt, sand, water barrel or garden hose

Consider Your Neighbors

- Be aware that neighbors may be negatively impacted by exposure to smoke
- Take precaution and check wind conditions prior to lighting any fires

seconds count, PLAN TWO WAYS OUT

Your family may not be together if a disaster strikes, so it is important to establish a family meeting place that's familiar and easy to find. And don't forget to think about specific needs in your family. Your family's needs change over time, so update your plan regularly.

Where Will We Meet?

Decide on safe, familiar, accessible places where your family can go for protection or to reunite. If you have pets or service animals, think about animal-friendly locations.



Consider places in your house, in your neighborhood and outside of your city or town so you're prepared for any situation.

Practice, Practice, Practice!

Write down your plans and contacts. Make sure everyone in

the family has copies and keeps them in a safe space, like in a backpack, wallet or taped in a notebook. Put them in your cell phone if you have one. Hold regular household meetings to review and practice your plan.

Who Will We Contact?

Pick the same person for each family member to contact. Pick someone out of town as they may be easier to reach in a disaster. Phone lines may be tied up in an emergency so text, don't talk, and leave phone lines open for emergency workers.
